Lay Language Overview of Engagement Opportunity

- Eligibility: Who are you looking for? What experiences do they need to bring to the opportunity?
- What partners are being asked to do

- Which specific research decisions partners will be able to inform
- How partners' input will be used in decision-making (i.e. level of engagement)

Roles/Responsibilities

- What is expected of partners (training, preparation, participation, reporting, etc.)
- What partners can expect of the research team members

Time Commitment and Duration

- When engagement is expected to start, in relation to overall project timelines
- Key timepoints of involvement (e.g. recruitment, interpretation)
- Number of estimated hours per week/month
- Expected duration of commitment and when/why this may change

Honorarium/compensation and reimbursement

Important note: honorarium/compensation refers to paying partners for their time, energy and expertise, and may be considered income by the Canada Revenue Agency. Reimbursement (or preferably, covering costs up front) is payment to cover costs partners incur as part of engagement, and should be separate from honorarium/compensation payment.

- Is compensation available (amounts can be discussed in person later)
- Which costs will be covered up front (e.g. parking passes, provision of internet/calling cards, bus tickets, printed materials provided, etc.)
